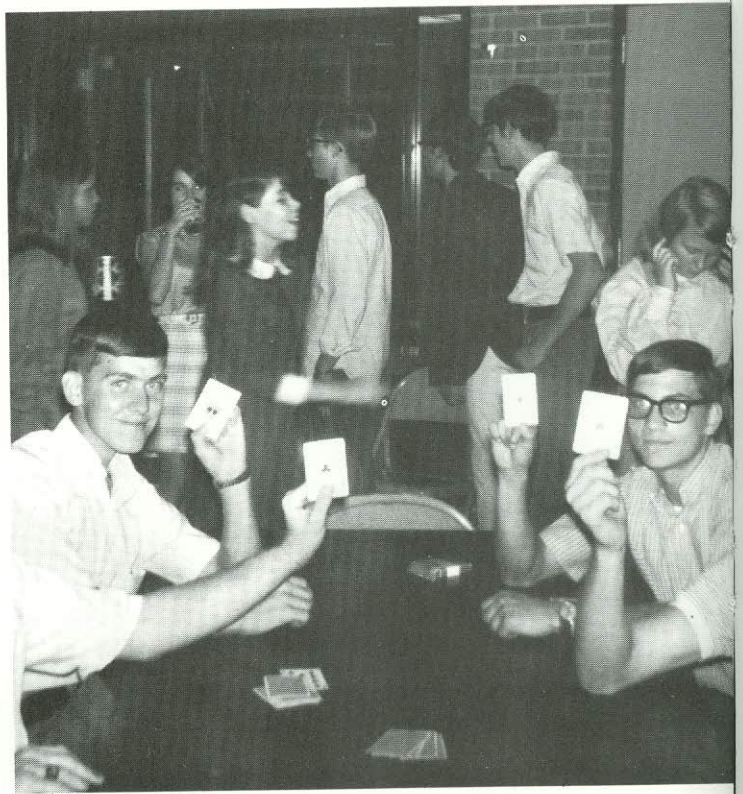


# School was lively
