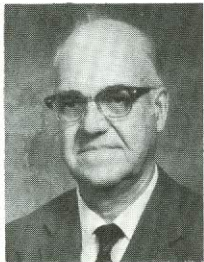


Industrial Arts

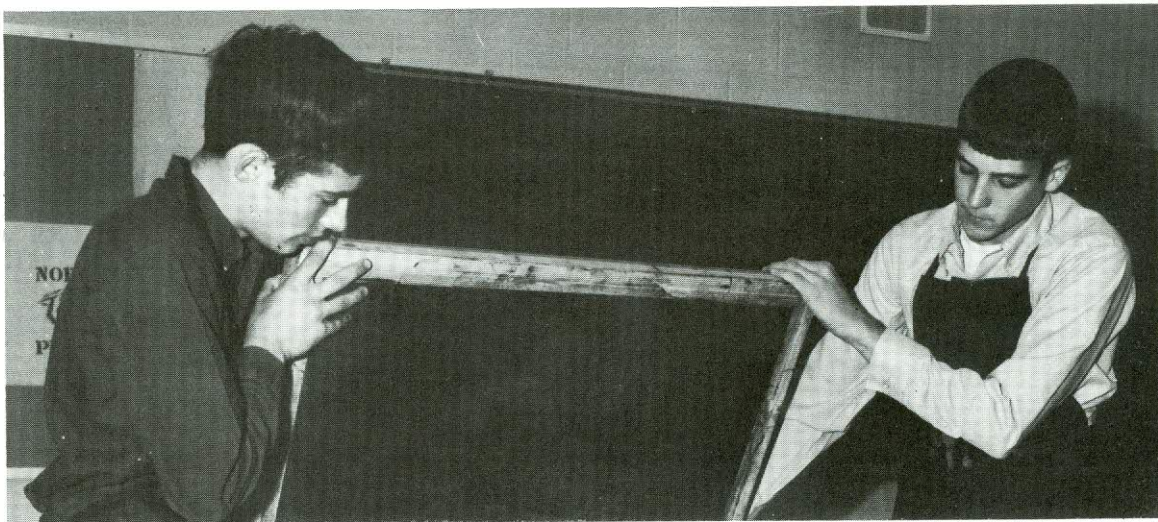


Industrial Arts was a series of courses designed to develop, in the mechanically adept student, skills in the application of common tools and machines, to extend creative technical talents in solving problems related to materials and process; thus giving a general knowledge of technical skills.

Drafting was created to strengthen technical imagination used to visualize plans in three dimensional effects, to think precisely, to create drawings, and to gain experience in reading and writing the industrial languages.

The courses in woods, metals, electricity, and graphic arts were all created and designed to give the capable student a preview of the general world of industry.
