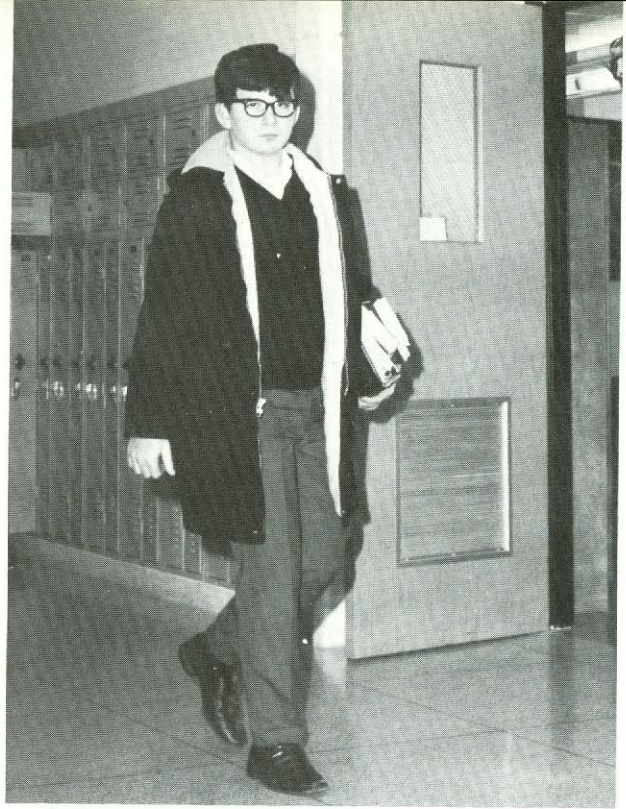


# Rocket Club blasts-off
