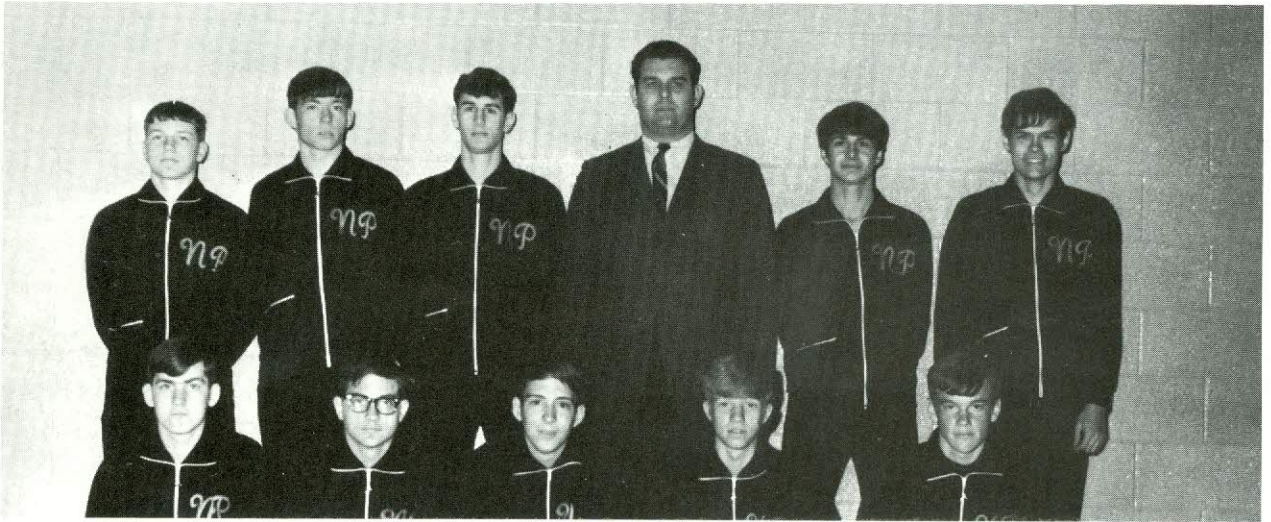
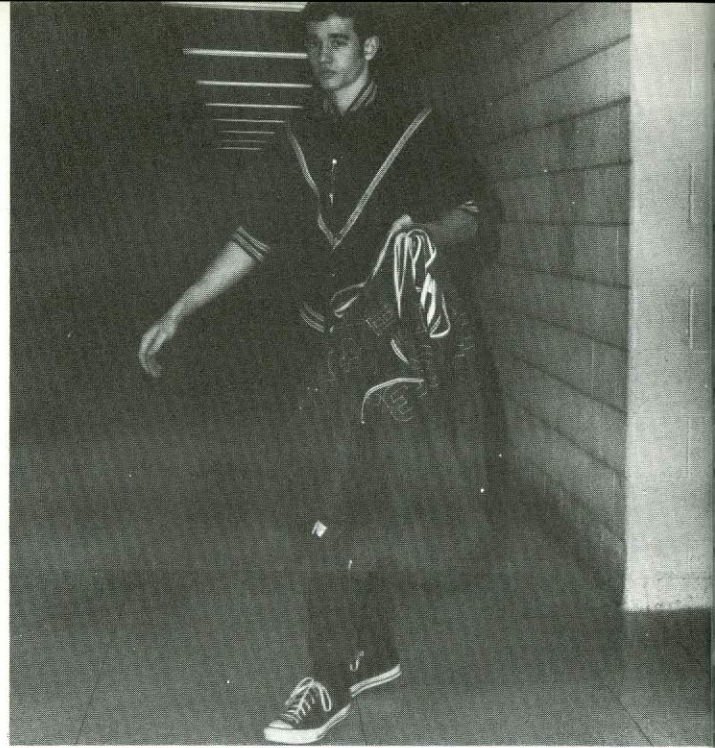


On your mark . . . get set . . . go!
