The seventh grade enjoyed--very noisily so--a class party February 18, 1970.

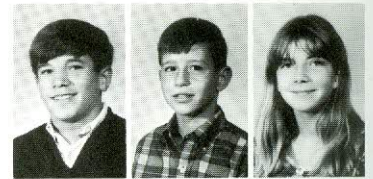
Facts and Five, potato chips, and cokes were on the agenda.
