

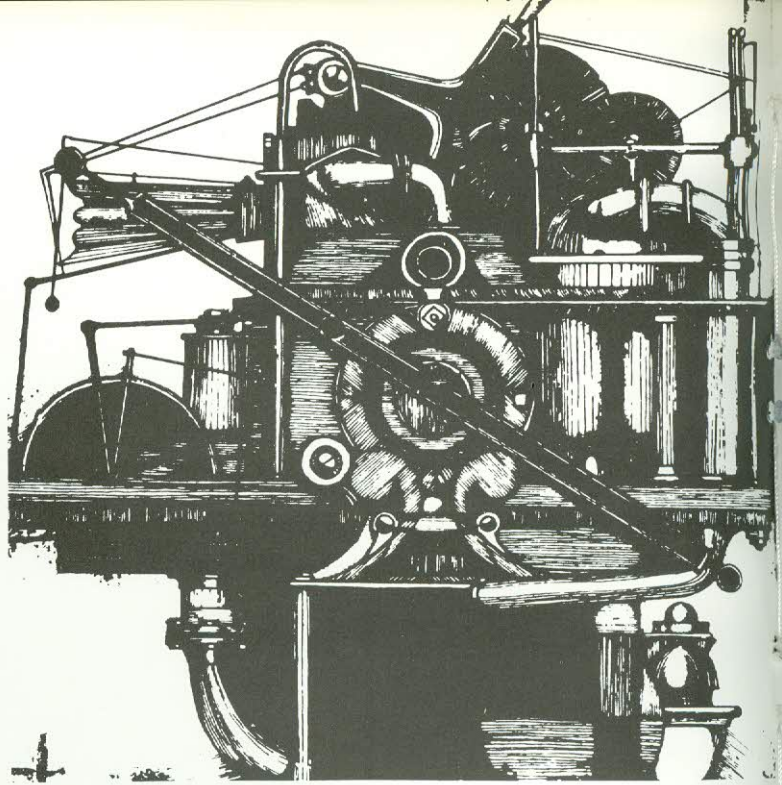
We became craftsmen of the arts.

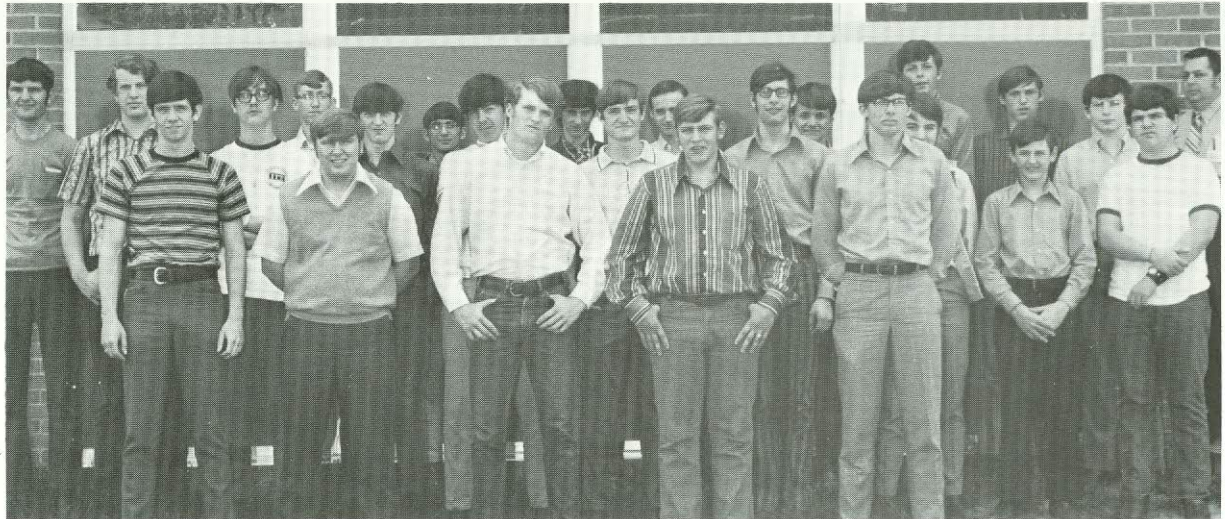
Many students who had taken industrial arts classes joined this club. They displayed posters, pictures, lamps, and other articles made by industrial arts students.
