"My first impression of North Putnam was that I didn't know where I was supposed to go."

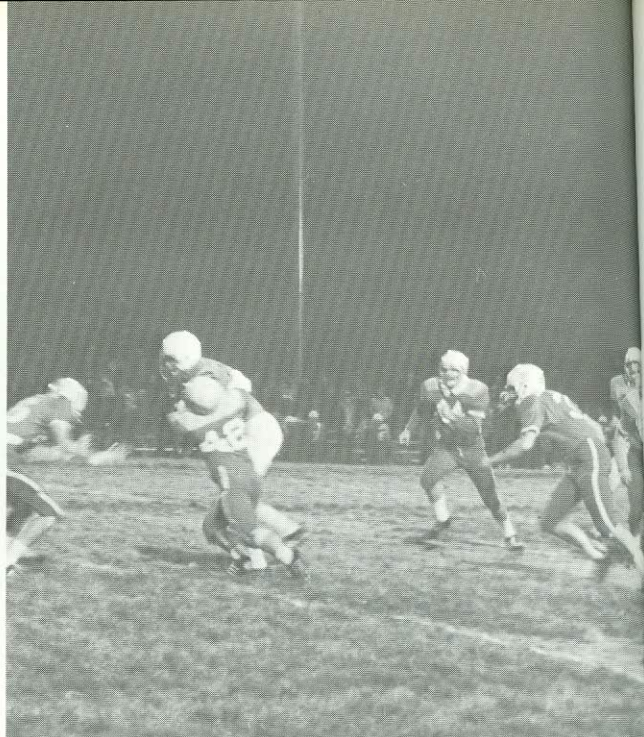
"The lockers were too little."
