

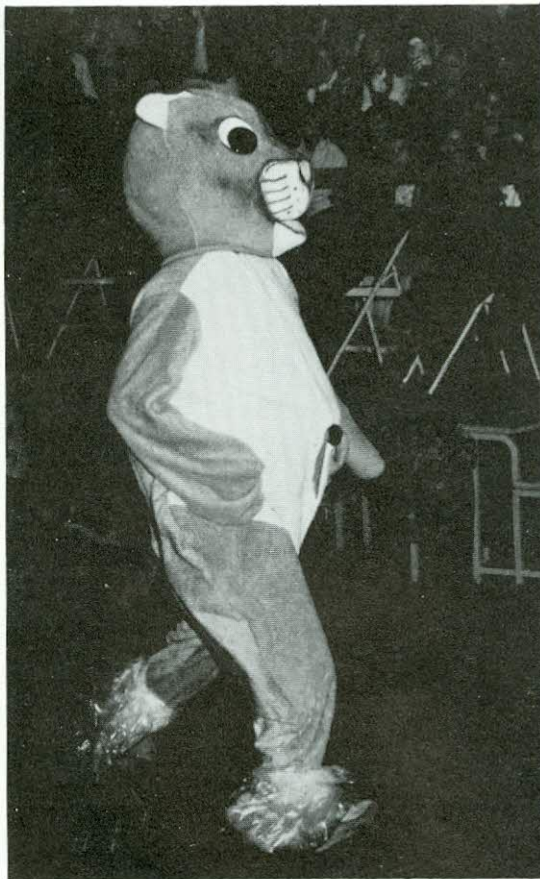

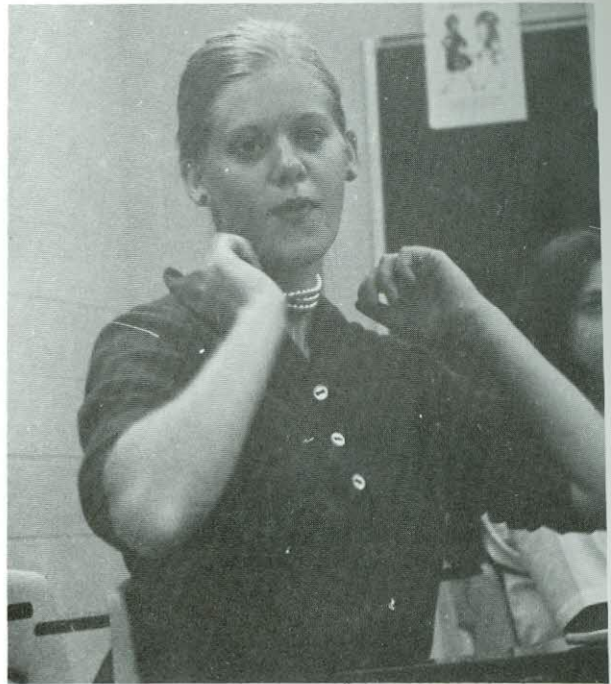
At Friday's Pep Session, the winning skit was announced. It was the Juniors' "Awards Day" presentation which was again given to the student body.
