



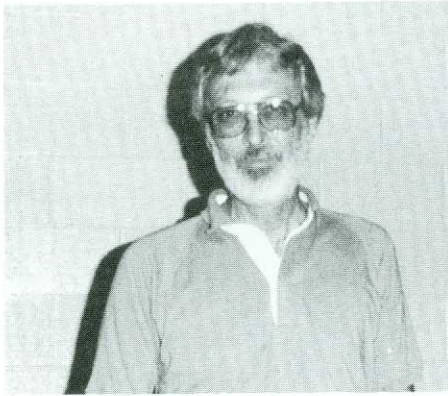
Mr. Bill Chestnut—Mathematics. "My prerogative is to teach students to be more responsible."

Miss Lisa Burns—Mathematics. "My prerogative is to teach kids to adapt to society and take on responsibility."



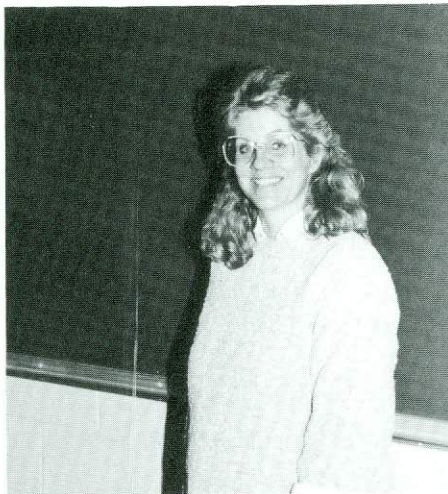
Mr. John Moser—Science Chairman. "My prerogative is to teach students to learn."
