



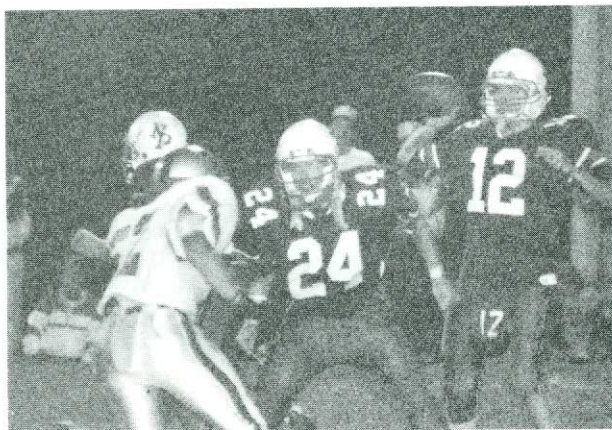
Freshman Princess: Jaime Henderson, escorted by Tom Boller
