

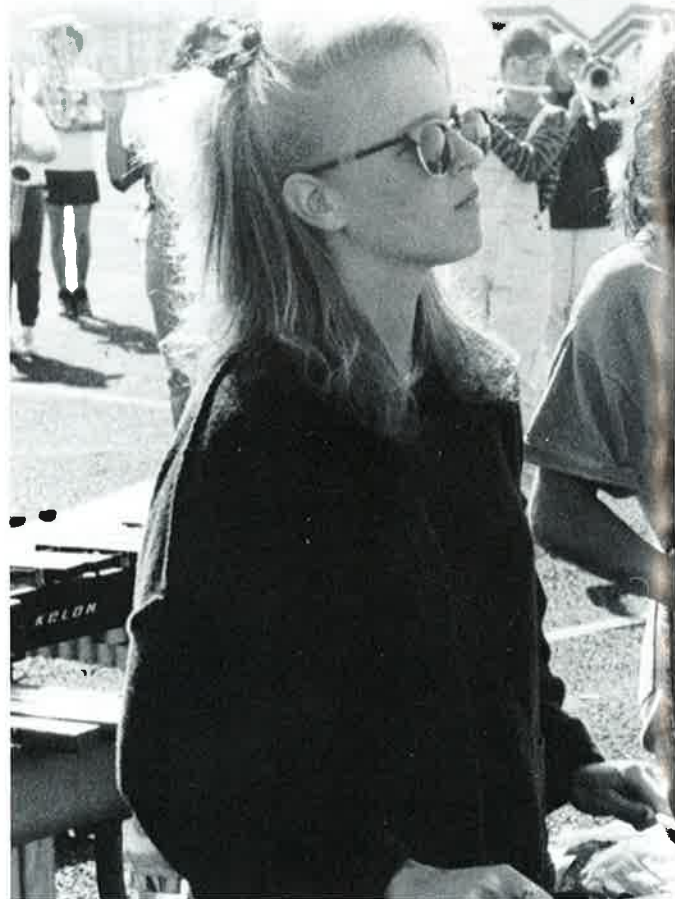
Seniors Survive Shaky Start

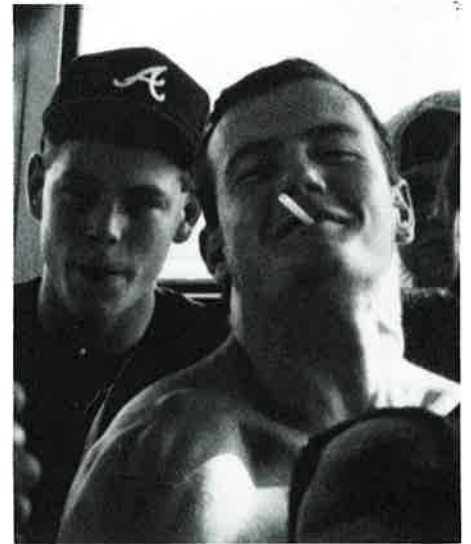
