The addition of five new girls went a long way in improving the Cougar Girls' Swim Program. A comment from senior Lisa Gearld seemed to be reflective of all new members.

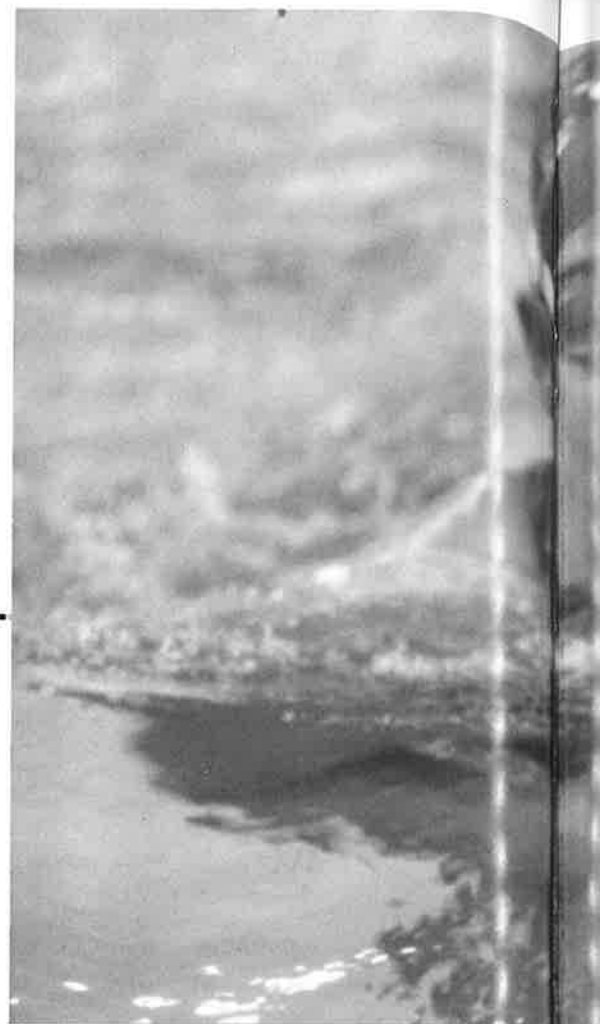
"Being a first year team member was difficult, but throughout the season, I was
