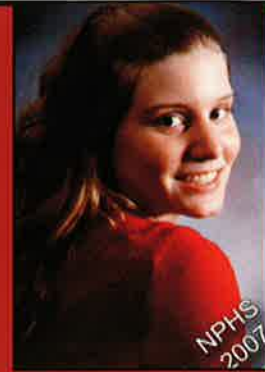
I love you very much and will always be here for you. Good luck in everything that you do in life.
