

*Probationary Status: The student, parent, and administrator sign an agreement allowing the student one (1) additional tardy to the class.

Debbie Sillery motioned to approve the above changes to the Tardy Policy at the middle school. Jon Buser seconded the motion, and it carried with a 4 – 0 vote.

B. High School Tardy Policy:

All students are expected to arrive to class on time with required materials. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that he/she arrives to class on time. Being late to class is an attendance behavior that will not be tolerated by the teachers and administration at North Putnam High School. The high school will use the following ladder when addressing students with an excessive number of tardies.

- 5 Tardies (one class): Teacher will conference with student
- 6 Tardies (one class): Parent Contact/Conference and student assigned one (1) day ISS
- 10 Tardies (one class): Parent meeting - student placed on probationary status and assigned three (3) days of GRASP. Failure to successfully complete the GRASP assignment will result in loss of credit for the class.

*Probationary Status: The student, parent, and administrator sign an agreement allowing the student one (1) additional tardy to the class. If the student exceeds the additional tardy, the student will be removed from the class with no credit and assigned to the ISS room.

Debbie Sillery motioned to approve the above changes to the Tardy Policy at the high school. Jon Buser seconded the motion, and it carried with a 4 – 0 vote.

IV. MCCORMICK’S CREEK TRIP

Ms. Jana Brothers and her sixth grade team members discussed the McCormick’s Creek trip with the Board of School Trustees. Sixth grade students have traditionally taken a three day trip to McCormick’s Creek each year. The teachers were concerned about the financial burden the trip might be imposing on the Corporation. They were also concerned about whether or not they would be permitted to continue to take a school nurse and a school counselor on the trip considering financial constraints. Dr. Lovejoy stated that the counselor would be permitted to go on the trip and a health aide or school nurse would also be permitted to attend. The teachers were assured that corporation monies were available for the trip. After discussion, the sixth grade team was asked to give the trip some careful thought and contact Dr. Lovejoy with their recommendation.
